A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM PAULA'S CLASS

Our class was busy learning about the voting process, watching debates and learning about the different candidates running for president. We practiced voting in our class on different things like what is your favorite pumpkin food and what is your favorite food made from corn. We voted in a private voting booth and only their aide was allowed to help them. They voted on an actual sample ballot and got a sticker when they voted.

Our class also has been busy talking about what buildings are in a community. We built our own buildings, folding and taping them. We made some roads on a large poster board and then the students decided where they wanted to put their buildings. We decided to put the jail by the law office and the courthouse. It was a fun activity and the students enjoyed figuring out what roads they have to take to get to certain buildings.


We have been working on our food preparation skills in Life Skills. Our class has been learning about measuring tools and how to use them. We made owl cupcakes and apple turkeys this week in preparation for Thanksgiving. The students love working with food even though it's hard to wait to eat everything until AFTER we finish decorating.



A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM JAMIE'S CLASS

Jamie's class is discovering the history behind Thanksgiving...

We have been extremely busy in our class reading a chapter book on the history behind Thanksgiving. My class was assigned a chapter a day where we found definitions of vocabulary words, read a chapter as a class using reading guiding strips to help keep students on track, and then answering 5- 10 comprehension questions per chapter. As a class we gave our opinions during each chapter on whether we enjoyed reading that chapter, before we moved onto the next. The students enjoyed learning the history behind Thanksgiving and why we celebrate it by reading *What Was the First Thanksgiving?* This was filled with historical background on the Pilgrims and the reasons behind their voyage to the New World, the native Wampanoag tribe, the challenges both groups encountered, plus the reason that Thanksgiving was made into a national holiday. The students also had fun sewing and creating their own Native American pouch. In the story these pouches were used to carry small pieces of food or small items to trade. We completed this chapter book before break. The class is now excited to move onto our History curriculum, Access American History. Our first chapter is on the first Americans. We are looking forward to exploring this chapter together on Native Americans and being hands on through projects and assignments.



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A PEAK INTO THE PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM WENDY'S CLASS

November marks the end of our outdoor adventures for a while. Our PE classes took full advantage of the beautiful weather to do many fun and educational activities. During Halloween week we played "clean out your backyard" which was a hit with all ages. Two teams start out with 12 nerf ball ghosts on either side of a low volleyball net. Upon hearing the go whistle they are to throw as many balls to the other team's "backyard" as fast as possible until the stop whistle blows. Students counted how many they had left on their side. Three rounds were played to determine the ultimate champion. Students had to use math skills to determine how many balls were needed to return to the winner's side in order to play the next round.

All classes also enjoyed raking leaves and jumping into the giant pile afterwards. That's right, they *enjoyed* raking leaves!

Finally, we began our unit on flag football this month. Students are brushing up their throwing, catching and running skills just in time for a Thanksgiving day catch. I'm so proud of my many students who were once afraid of the football and now really enjoy playing catch with a friend or staff member. If your son or daughter seems afraid to catch any ball start at a close range, throw it to them underhand and aim it toward their chest, not their face. Slowly increase the distance between you and *maybe* begin to throw to them overhand. Encourage them to throw overhand to you.

In our *Celebrate the Season* after school group we have made several crafts to represent what happens during the seasons. We made a beautiful vase with sunflowers, we made a pinch paper apple picture as well as our very own leaf globes with leaves falling off the tree.




