




A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM ANDREW'S CLASS



Can "sense" technology such as a bracelet or sock help my child with emotional

CONTrol? Rosalind W. Picard, ScD from the MIT Media Lab will share with us how the latest technology measuring and supporting an individual's emotional levels is now available for parents and professionals alike. Come hear about technology that can help children and teens' emotional development, and see video examples of how it works, along with a case presentation by Tal Baz, MS, OTR/L.

What is the relationship between autism, pain, and challenging behaviors?

Ricki Robinson, MD, MPH, pediatrician and autism specialist, will lead a panel of experts including Lonnie Zeltzer, MD, who will share about mind-body strategies for managing pain and anxiety in autism and special needs.

The Montgomery Rodeo in Skillman, NJ is a community non-profit that is a popular annual event in the area. For more than 20 years, we have put on a weekend of top-notch rodeo entertainment that has raised substantial funds for local charities and non-profits. Last year, we hosted our first Special Needs Rodeo Performance and it was met with such great success, we are doing it again this year.

"Last year we wanted to add a show for kids and families who wouldn't normally be able to take advantage of this type of event," said Noel Drift, Montgomery Rodeo co-founder. "We received tremendous feedback from the families. One mother wrote, 'Our family would never have been able to attend this type of event in a usual setting, thank you for this opportunity.' We are very happy to be able to offer this special performance again."

The Special Needs Rodeo Performance was designed to include all of the regular rodeo events, yet modified to make it more sensory-friendly. After collaborating with Eden Autism Services, one of the rodeo charities, and Sam and Carrie Swearingen, of Rawhide Rodeo Company, Montgomery Rodeo producer, we are able to offer a friendlier environment for this community and their families. This year, we are offering even more events for family participation and a closer, more personal experience overall.

Along with this wonderful Special Needs Rodeo, the Montgomery Rodeo will host two big shows, **Saturday, June 11, 7 pm, and Sunday, June 12, 2 pm**. These shows include bull riding, bronco riding, barrels, calf roping, and several children's events including mutton busting and a stick horse race. Last year, the Montgomery Rodeo distributed \$35,000 to charitable organizations, which includes our special needs advisors, Eden Autism Services.
