




### A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM AMANDA'S CLASS

## A PEAK INTO THE PROGRAM SFSS

PLAY: An essential job in childhood for healthy development

Did you ever wonder why "play" is emphasized in CTC's DIR FloorTime educational and therapeutic interventions?

Play is a native manner of expression found across species and occurs throughout the lifespan into adulthood. Yes, play is a vital activity for healthful living for children and adults.

In childhood, *play* is a facilitator of development. Human children use play as a medium for self-expression. Play serves as a powerful force in the drive toward self-regulatory capacities, independence, symbolic thinking, and as a laboratory for interpersonal and intrapersonal conflict and resolution.

Play-based interventions are indispensable in CTC's DIR FloorTime work. <u>Play is not done for the sake of play</u>. Play is an essential instrument used by CTC's therapists and educators to organize a child's experiences as we work toward strengthening the child's relational, communicative, and cognitive functioning. Through play, meaningful relationships are developed, fostered and maintained in a fun way.

In summary, play:

- •Facilitates maturational gains in the DIR Functional Emotional Developmental Levels
- •Allows children a means of motoric expression of inner experience that they may not be able to express verbally or experiences that they may find threatening to express verbally
- •Provides therapists and teachers with a means to conduct assessment of therapeutic and educational progress.

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The New Jersey Special Olympics Area 3 is excited to host its annual Track & Field competition at Hackettstown High School for its 12<sup>th</sup> year. The date is set for **Saturday**, **May 6**, **2017**. There is no rain date for the event. Based on the regulations from Special Olympics, all Celebrate the Children (CTC) students who are age 8 years or above are eligible to participate in the competition. Accommodations are made to support the athletes and each competitor is successful and receives a medal. All participating athletes must arrive for registration between 8:00 and 8:30 am and opening ceremonies begin at 9:00 am.

Special Olympics has updated their paperwork since our last time participating in the Track & Field competition. Each athlete must now have a valid PARTICIPANT RELEASE FORM and ATHLETE MEDICAL FORM on file. The participant release form is new documentation. Both of these forms must be completed every three years. Special Olympics has stressed that they must have the ORIGINAL participant release form and athlete medical forms. They will not accept scanned or faxed copies. Please see the attached "Athlete Registration and Special Olympics NJ Medical Policy" for further information.

We have also included a CTC LETTER OF INTENT. Please fill out this form if you intend for your child to participate in the competition. It includes an area to document the competitor's t-shirt size. Each student will receive a shirt to wear during the competition and it is a souvenir for them to remember the experience.

Please be aware that this is not a CTC run event. We have learned that it is a long day for the students and there is a lot of waiting involved for all who participate. Unfortunately, we are not informed of times of events. Track events take place in the morning and field events (softball, TurboJav, and shot put) are in the early afternoon. Each athlete may compete in up to a maximum of two track events, one field event, and one relay race. In the event that the day is too long for your athlete, you have the option to participate in only the morning track session. If the wait time is not an issue, sign up your athlete for both the morning track and afternoon field events.

Please return the **ORIGINAL** PARTICIPANT RELEASE FORM, ATHLETE MEDICAL FORM, and CTC LETTER OF INTENT to CTC (c/o Danielle Dieckmann and Lisa Bruno) by **Friday, March 3, 2017**. Unfortunately, there is no exception to the due date. Any forms submitted after March 3<sup>rd</sup> will **NOT** be accepted and the athlete will be unable to participate in this year's competition. If your athlete competed in the past with CTC's Track & Field team, they have a current medical form on file unless we specifically notify you otherwise. These athletes will still need to submit a participant release form and CTC letter of intent.

**February 8**<sup>th</sup> at 10:00 am - Bobbie Gallagher, MA, BCBA will be presenting on **Sexuality & Hygiene for Adolescents with Developmental Disabilities - What Caregivers Need to know**. Adolescence can be a difficult time for children and families, and can be especially difficult for children with developmental disabilities and their families. This presentation will provide an overview of the specific challenges present during puberty and adolescence, specifically issues of sexuality and hygiene. Strategies for increasing independence in grooming, hygiene, health, and dressing will be reviewed. In addition, issues and strategies surrounding sexuality, modesty, privacy, boundaries and personal safety will be discussed.
