He has developed a program using independent typing as a way to increase communication and language production in his patients. It is our hope that we can replicate his work at CTC in the near future. We look forward to her return to learn if there are other ideas that we can put into place, here at CTC, to increase our students independent communication abilities.

This month in science, Ms. Jamie's class has been busy learning about rocks and how they are made of different combinations of minerals. We are also learning about the three categories of rock and how they are formed. The students enjoyed being able to see and feel the different rocks, their colors and textures. 




A PEEK INTO THE CLASSROOM JOE'S CLASS
