A PEEK INTO THE CLASSROOM AMY'S CLASS

This year in Language Arts, Amy's class has used a program called Start-to-Finish.com. It is a large library of adapted novels that can be read aloud to students, via Smart Board or iPad. In the program, all characters have different voices and there are pictures to go along with each chapter. Students are able to read a variety of types of literature this way. They have the option to read classic novels, biographies, fictional stories, teenage appropriate topics and more. This program has been very successful because it incorporates both visual and auditory aspects of learning. Each student has his or her own login information in order to gain access to their accounts. After each chapter, they have a comprehension quiz to reinforce their understanding of the material covered. Their scores are all kept in their individual accounts in order to evaluate their progress throughout the school year. This program is very motivational for students and they love reading all of the stories!! Students are now able to read literature like their peers, at a pace and level that helps them to understand and enjoy the books.

Here is a short preview of what is to come:


