### A PEEK INTO THE CLASSROOM PAULA'S CLASS

Our class has been learning about the scientific process and different ways we can do a science project. Each student cut up apples and made a before and after chart. The students used observation to determine the color of the apples and then colored them in on the chart (the skin was red, the inside yellow). We left the apples out overnight and looked at them the next day and observed what happened to the apples. We cut a fresh apple and compared it to the ones left overnight. The students determined the apples left out were brown and wrinkled compared to the fresh yellow apple. The class colored in their before and after observations of their apple.

Our class also observed Veterans Day by looking at the uniforms of the different branches of the services and learning the names of these services. We then played a matching game by finding different characteristics of each uniform and matched it with the correct branch of service. The class was introduced to the meaning of the red poppy as a symbol of remembrance for the Veterans who have served our country. The students painted their own poppy and added a sign saying "We Remember".

We have also been learning vocabulary and symbols of the upcoming holiday of Thanksgiving.

We have looked at Indian Corn and recreated it with our own painting. We have also laced the different shapes of a cornucopia, turkey leg and pumpkin. The class is learning songs about the first Thanksgiving as well as the Pilgrims and Native Americans. Additionally, we have been talking about different foods that may be served at the holiday dinner. The class has prepared their own cornbread and pumpkin pie and will be trying pumpkin butter on cinnamon crackers. We will also be making apple turkeys to take home as a decoration for the table.

The class has also been learning about what nocturnal means, "sleeps all day and is up all night". We have discussed different animals that are nocturnal, one of course, being the OWL! We are making beautiful paintings of the owl sitting on branches in the moonlight to hang on our brand new bulletin boards along with very cool leaf paintings on fabric with a toothbrush!
