

A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM KELLY'S CLASS

Kelly's Concepts of Physics and Chemistry classes have recently been studying chemical reactions. To illustrate this topic, students were able to create natural glue from products we find in our kitchens. Students were able to observe milk being heated to boiling and then the addition of vinegar to the boiled milk. The vinegar reacts with the milk to separate it into curds and whey. The solid curds are then filtered out and mixed with a small amount of baking soda and water. The reaction of these household items forms a natural glue, which we were able to test by verifying that when dry, it securely held two pieces of paper together.

A PEAK INTO THE CLASSROOM ANDREW'S CLASS

Andrew's class has been exploring the passage of time on different scales by creating multiple timelines. All year long, students in US History will be contributing to an ongoing timeline of the events we are learning about. Students are encouraged to express their understanding of the lesson by creating event cards that get hung on a collaborative timeline. Event cards include the year the event occurred, a brief description of the event, and a drawing that reflects the event.

Andrew's homeroom is also collaborating on a timeline of events in our class. Each time an important event happens in our class, our students create an event card for it and hang it up on our ongoing classroom timeline. Our students love adding to it, and as the year moves on it will be a great way to reflect on all the things they have done and accomplished as a classroom.




